TRAINING

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL IN-HOME AND DAYCARE CENTER PROVIDERS

Background check and fingerprinting

15+ courses per year to remain licensed

Must ensure proper nutrition, outside time, healthy routines, and sleep

Must conduct monthly fire drills and tornado drills from March through October and quarterly active shooter drills

Training in standard precautions, prevention of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), use of safe sleep practices, preventing shaken baby syndrome and abusive head trauma, recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect, and medication administration, first aid, CPR, emergency preparedness, and building and physical premises
